

# Data protection information regarding the collection of mobility data of TU Wien employees and students

Protecting and securing data are important matters at TU Wien. Personal data are processed in strict compliance with the principles and requirements laid down in GPDR<sup>1</sup> and DSG<sup>2</sup>. TU Wien only processes those data required for the purposes intended and at all times endeavours to ensure the security and accuracy of the data.

An essential part of the future sustainability strategy of TU Wien is a comprehensive mobility concept for the employees and students of TU Wien. The objective is to reduce energy consumption and traffic-induced CO<sub>2</sub> emissions by means of sustainable technologies and intelligent concepts, to advance the energy transition, and in doing so to enable sustainable mobility for TU Wien. For this purpose, the Rector of TU Wien has commissioned the Faculty of Civil and Environmental Engineering with collecting a data basis regarding the mobility behaviour of the employees and students of TU Wien.

### Purpose of data processing

- Mobility behaviour on a reference date (address, time, mode of transport, purpose of trip)

### Which categories of data subjects are affected by the processing?

This data collection activity concerns active employees and active students of TU Wien.

## Legal basis of the data processing

Such use of personal data is based on Article 6 par 1 (b) (execution of a contract) and Article 6 par 1 (e) (performance of a task in the public interest) of GDPR. The data will be collected directly from you when you enter your data in the online questionnaire.

# Category of recipients of personal data

The data will be processed anonymously if possible, and will always be processed in pseudonymised form by the staff of the Transportation Research Unit at TU Wien.

# Data processing outside the European Union

The data will not be processed outside the TU Wien.

## **Duration of data storage**

We store your data for as long as required according to statutory retention periods, or as long as the data is necessary in order to achieve the purpose of its collection.

# Your rights in connection with personal data

You may object to the processing of your data in accordance with Article 21 of GDPR on grounds relating to your particular situation. An objection will only result in us refraining from processing your data if the objection is justified on special grounds and the compelling reasons of TU Wien for processing the data do not outweigh these special grounds. If you wish to object to the collection and further processing of your data within the framework of the online assessment and control, please contact the individuals responsible for the assessment without delay, citing more detailed reasons.

As the data subject affected by the processing of these data, you have the following rights vis-à-vis TU Wien:

- the right to information;
- the right to rectification;
- the right to erasure;
- · the right to restriction of processing of your data;
- the right to data portability

As the **data subject**, you also have the right to complain to the Data Protection Authority concerning any alleged inadmissible data processing or our failure to fulfil our obligations arising from GDPR.
